Blyth Snowtown v Southern Saints

A1

Blyth Snowtown 59 defeated Southern Saints 46

Both teams came out in force in the first quarter with Saint's Georgina Pfitzner shooting and moving well. Blyth Snowtown started the second quarter with some great intercepts in defence and Ellie Gould (GA) finishing off well to extend their lead. Saints came out firing in the third quarter, with great passages of play to close the gap, but Blyth Snowtown settled with some great shooting by their goalies which saw the lead be pushed out to thirteen.
