NORTH CLARE V BLYTH/SNOWTOWN

A1

North Clare 32 v Blyth/Snowtown 59

Both teams made a strong start, with Blyth/Snowtown capitalising on their height advantage in the goal circle. At the other end, North Clare's Zoe Pawelski worked tirelessly to keep her team in the game.

Both sides continued to contest strongly for turnovers throughout the match. North Clare Gracie Francis impressed with several key intercepts, while Kali Cooke-Shakles made a noticeable impact for Blyth/Snowtown after being moved into defence.
