**A1**

**North Clare 39 – South Clare 42**

North Clare and South Clare battled through a fiercely contested match, with the opening quarter showcasing strong drive from both sides and intense defensive pressure, leaving North trailing by two at the first break.

A key positional change saw Kirsty Baum move into WD for North, creating crucial turnovers that shifted momentum, while Bella Rawlings and Trinity Mannings combined well in attack with accurate shooting to push North ahead by eight at halftime.

The second half remained highly competitive, with both teams maintaining defensive intensity; Jorja Rogers stood out for South with several impressive intercepts that were capitalised on to close the gap.

South carried that momentum into the final quarter Ellie Falconer providing great drive through the mid court, continuing to apply relentless pressure and eventually clawing their way back to secure a win in the final minutes.
